

Crisis Resources for Mental Health Emergencies

Warmline/Hotline: Available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week

Mobile Crisis Team: A mobile crisis team is available 7 days/week from 10am-12 midnight for adults and children.

Mobile crisis teams will go to the individual's home to provide crisis services. The mobile crisis team will go to a clinic where the individual is located, if the clinic grants permission. The crisis team will not go to hospitals. Crisis beds may be provided to adults in psychiatric distress.

Baltimore City Crisis Response, Inc. (BCRI): (410) 433-5255 / (410) 433-5175 / 711

Hotline: Available 24 hours/day, 7 days/week. Provides help to people who are having a psychiatric (mental health) crisis and to people who are homeless.

Crisis Team Services: From 8am-8pm, 7 days/week, the Crisis Team will go to where a Baltimore City resident in crisis is located to provide crisis services. The Crisis Team provides services to adults in the individual's home, hospital emergency department, clinic, or any other location in or near Baltimore City. BCRI provides beds to people in psychiatric crisis, including people in need of drug or alcohol detoxification. BCRI provides aftercare and provides assistance applying for benefits. BCRI cannot assist people with major non-psychiatric medical problems.

Baltimore Child and Adolescents Response System (B-CARS): (410) 433-5175

B-CARS provides crisis services to people under 18 years old who are having a psychiatric crisis and who are residents of Baltimore City. B-CARS services youth in their homes, emergency department, clinic, foster home, or wherever the youth is located. B-CARS helps arrange for any other necessary services and provides follow-up care to youths who have been discharged from a hospital. B-CARS takes calls 24 hours a day every day. Emergency department personnel can call from 9am-8pm.

Baltimore County Crisis Team: (410) 931-2214

Hotline: Available 24 hours/day, 7 days/week

Mobile Crisis Team (MCT): Staffed by specially trained county police officers and mental health clinicians, MCT can respond on-site to calls from the eastern portion of Baltimore County. Daily hours of operation from 10am-1am.

In-Home Intervention Team (IHIT): Staffed by mental health professionals, IHIT can provide non-crisis, on-site assistance County-wide, Monday – Friday, 12pm-8pm.

Urgent Care Clinic: Two locations available 7 days/week, Monday-Friday evenings, Weekends daytime. The clinic can provide an appointment within 48 hours for urgent cases requiring assessment and brief treatment.

Hotline: Available 9 am – 12 am

Mobile Crisis Services: Provides mental health crisis stabilization in the community. Links individual to mental health resources.

The Klein Family Harford Crisis Center: Provides residents walk-in crisis services at the clinic located at: 802 Baltimore Pike, Bel Air, MD 21014, from 9 am – 9 pm. Same day evaluations/intervention.

Mobile Crisis Services: Mobile crisis services are available from 8am-12midnight. Services are provided to anyone located in Harford County experiencing a psychiatric/mental health crisis. The individual does not have to be a resident of Harford County. Services may be provided where the individual is located in the County, including a home, a community location, and at hospital emergency departments.

Hotline: Available 24 hours/day, 7 days/week

Office: Located at 6700 Freetown Road, Columbia, MD 21044. Adults and youth may walk-in for crisis services 24 hours, 7 days a week. (Grassroots Crisis Intervention Center; 410-531-6006)

Mobile Crisis Services: A mobile crisis team responds to psychiatric emergencies, family crises, and other traumatic events, with the police to private residences, workplaces, accident scenes, and public locations in the county. Available 24 hours/day, 7 days/week.
